A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE FORMATION OF TWO LOCAL PROBUS CLUBS

The name PROBUS is an amalgam of the words PROfessional and BUSiness and membership of the original clubs was based on such qualifications. Membership in current times is based on being "to anyone of good character who has had some measure of responsibility or achievement in any field of worthy Endeavour".

Following a suggestion from Strathfield Rotary, a meeting was held in November 1980 to determine if there was interest in forming a club in Strathfield. The meeting decided that a club should be formed and the Inaugural meeting, with eleven members present, was held in the small hall of St Anne's Church on Monday 8th December, 1980. The first guest speaker at the February 1981 meeting was Mr Bob Lawler, a friend of the President, who operated a logging company on Vancouver Island.

The Charter meeting of the Club was held in July 1981 at which the then President of the Rotary Club, Mr Brain Hennell, presented the Probus President, Mr Brian Cullen-Wood with his badge of office as a gift from Rotary. The adopted motto of the club was: "Grow old along with me, the best is yet to be" from Robert Browning's poem "Rabbi Ben Ezra".

During the 1980's it became necessary to establish a waiting list of men, desiring to join and as the waiting list grew consideration was given for the formation of a new club in the area. After agreement that this should be done, member George Hallworth left Strathfield Probus and formed South Strathfield Probus.

An operational change took place in October 2000 when the members, all male, voted for the club to become a combined club.



The ABBA story began in June 1966 when Bjorn Ulvaes (Born 1945) met Benny Anderson (born (1946) for the first time. Bjorn was a member of the Hootenanny Singers, a very popular folk music group, while Benny played keyboards in Sweden's biggest pop group of the 1960's, the Hep Stars.

In the Spring of 1969, Bjorn and Benny met the two women who were to become not only their fiances', but also the other half of ABBA. Agnetha Falskog had been a successful solo singer since her first single in 1967.

Anni-Frid Lyngstad, of Norwegian origin, moved to Sweden at a very early age. They collaborated musically by contributing songs, some Instrumental and vocal backing to the recordings theyeach made as solo or duo acts. In 1970, the attractive sound of their four voices combined gave them the idea to put together a cabaret act, Festfolk, which has the double Meaning: "engaged couples" and "party people".

From 1972 nobody could have imagined that within a few years ABBA would evolve into a global phenomenon not heard since the Beatles.


This Swedish group became one of the most commercially successful groups in the history of pop music, topping the
