

NEW45 YEARS (M)
Time waits for no man ... and wife, UK, 95 min
A searing drama charged with raw, yet poignant fury, 45 Years' riveting story begins in the English countryside. Geoff (Tom Courtenay) and Kate (Charlotte Rampling) are soon to celebrate a landmark wedding anniversary with family and friends. Word arrives that Swiss police have found the immaculately preserved corpse of a 27-year-old woman in an alpine glacier. Forensics reveal she died a half-century ago. Geoff has been notified of the discovery, as he was her boyfriend at the time. The pair were on a hiking trip when she fell through a hidden fissure in the ice. What follows in 45 Years is an achingly precise measurement of the devastating effect this news will have over coming days. The astonishing performances of Rampling (Oscar-nominated) and Courtenay combine into a powder keg of repressed emotions. With just one false move — or is that one truthful word? — it feels as if their characters could combust right before you.
