

TAKE A CLOSER LOOK NSW STATE LIBRARY Gary Cook

After retiring in 2002, Gary has involved himself in a variety of volunteering roles. Currently, he is a Volunteer Speaker and Guide for Tours and Exhibitions at the State Library of NSW, Volunteer Speaker for the Sydney Harbour Federation Trust, Volunteer Speaker and Guide for Historic Houses Trust, Volunteer Justice of the Peace at Balmain Local Court and Deputy Chair of Hyde Park Inn Hotel.



The State Library of New South Wales is the major public reference and information service for NSW. The Library comprises two wings, The Mitchell Wing, housing the Australian research collections and the Macquarie Street Wing, housing a general reference collection

The presentation details the development of both the historic Mitchell Library and the State Library building in Macquarie Street. It will discuss the major private benefactors, detailing their contributions to the Library. In addition it will discuss the many and varied roles of this public institution - literary resource, conservator, preserver, exhibitor and a leading world Library of the technological age. The presentation also showcases the magnificent historical architectural features throughout the building such as the decorative stonework, stained glass windows and magnificent bronze doors of the Mitchell Library. The marble mosaic reproduction of the Tasman Map in the Mitchell Vestibule and the beautiful Tudor style Shakespeare Room. The presentation then focuses on the newly refurbished State Reference Library showcasing the features of a contemporary Library with technological innovation and highlights other areas of interest such as the popular Family History section, Friends Room, Exhibition Galleries and the new Amaze Gallery.
